# Registration for the 2009/2010 School Year

For parents registering students for the first time, general information can be found on the District website at [www.sd23.bc.ca](http://www.sd23.bc.ca) or by calling (250) 860-8888.

	<b>Middle and Secondary:</b>	<b>August 31, 2009 September 1 &amp; 2, 2009</b>	<b>8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.</b>

### REGISTRATION OPTIONS:

Government legislation allows parents and students the option to choose any school providing space is available. District regulations, however, may determine priority for enrollment at a specific school.

### KINDERGARTEN:

- To qualify for entry in September 2009, a child must be five years of age by December 31, 2009
- **A valid birth certificate of the child must be provided at the time of registration**
- Parents should provide the school with the child's immunization record
- The School Act allows a parent to defer the enrollment of a child's entry to school for not more than one year. Parents are encouraged to discuss deferment with the school principal before a decision is made

### ELEMENTARY, MIDDLE & SECONDARY:

- **A valid birth certificate of the student must be provided at the time of registration**
- The student should have a copy of the most recent report card, or transcript, from their previous school. These documents will facilitate appropriate placement

### STUDENT OF NON-RESIDENT

- Students who are Canadian citizens, but whose parents are non-BC residents, must pay tuition in order to access an educational program in B.C., including our school district. International students must also pay for access to S.D. No.23 programs

## REGISTERING FOR THE ENGLISH PROGRAM

### WHERE TO REGISTER:

- Registration at your catchment area school is encouraged, but not required
- If you do not know your catchment area school, phone (250) 491-4040 or refer to: [www.sd23.bc.ca](http://www.sd23.bc.ca) and click on the following link: **SD Busing and School Locator** button. Next, click on the tab that says **EduLog/WebQuery**. Enter your address and your child's grade and click "Go"
- Parents should be aware that decisions related to placement will be made during the first week of school at which time the actual number of students enrolled and the classroom/school capacities are known
- **Note:** Some schools are in open boundary catchment areas. They are:
  1. All of the Rutland area elementary schools constitute an open boundary catchment area. Parents who live in this area may apply for registration at any one of the elementary schools in Rutland
  2. A.S. Matheson, Casorso and Raymer Elementaries constitute an open boundary catchment area. Parents who live in this area may apply to register their children at any one of these three schools
  3. George Pringle, Glenrosa, Helen Gorman, and Peachland Elementaries constitute the Westside South open boundary catchment area. Parents who live in this area may apply to register their children at any one of these schools

## BUSING

**All parents who are registering students at schools in S.D. No. 23 for the first time should determine eligibility at the website listed below or phone (250) 491-4040 for information about school bus transportation services.**

- Notes:
- (1) The student transportation charge is \$200 per student per year. A Family plan is available for families with three or more children on the bus. Subsidies may be requested through the school principal.
  - (2) Eligible riders are those who live 4.0 km for K-3 and 4.8 km for grades 4 – 12 from their closest school. At the discretion of the Board of Education, eligible riders who pay the transportation charge may be transported via a school board owned and operated bus; or alternatively, transportation assistance payments may be made to parents. The Board recognizes that many students do not qualify for bus transportation as outlined above, and therefore authorizes the transportation of such students on existing bus routes, provided the charge is paid and space is available. Where feasible, the priority for these non-eligible courtesy riders will be based on the furthest distance from their designated catchment area school.
  - (3) School bus routes for the 2009/2010 school year will be advertised in the Capital News at the end of August.
  - (4) School bus route information is also available from the S.D. No. 23 web site at [www.sd23.bc.ca](http://www.sd23.bc.ca). Click on **SD Busing and School Locator** button. Next, click on the tab that says **EduLog/WebQuery**. Enter your address and your child's grade and click "Go." Please note some busing restrictions may apply in all open boundary catchment areas. Please contact Transportation at (250) 491-4040 to confirm busing eligibility in open boundary catchment areas.
  - (5) Busing is not provided to non-area "schools of choice".
