- The Indigenous Six Year BC Resident Completion Rate is 83.0% as compared to the provincial average of 72.5%.



....many schools participated in the **Annual Terry Fox Run** in commemoration of Terry Fox, and his Marathon of Hope, and to raise funds for cancer research. In total \$55,444.10 was raised for cancer research.

Okanagan Mission Secondary School held their 2022 Relay for Life and raised \$34,500.

MUCH TO BE PROUD OF..... SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY



- A District Music Program Ukrainian Fundraising Event is taking place at Prospera Place involving over 450 students from 11 various schools.
- Many schools took part in the Jump Rope for Heart.
- An Art Show was held at an elementary school to raise funds for the local SPCA.
- Families and staff donated over 16,000 pounds of food, thousands of clothing items, nearly \$15,000 in gift cards and donations, 75 food hampers, and over 600 new toys for food banks and individual families.
- Significant amounts of food, clothing and money raised in the Fall for families in neighbouring School Districts who were displaced by floods.
- Students volunteered on a Saturday for the Central Okanagan Food Bank Stuff a Bus Campaign
- "Adopted" 26 dogs through Paws It Forward donations

- Participated in school and community-based events by Zoom (due to COVID-19 restrictions) and in person
- Participated in 7 School Community Learning Conversations
- Met with Municipal Councils, the Westbank First Nation, area MLAs and area MPs (by Zoom due to COVID-19 restrictions and in person)
- Conducted 8 surveys and 2 Public Engagement Sessions
- 27 Policies/Regulations/Appendix/Forms were amended, and 2 Policies were affirmed

- Accepted the Health Promoting Schools Level 1 Review
- Approved the Annual Facility Grant (AFG) Plan for 2022/2023 through 2027-2028
- Sent 4 letters advocating on behalf of public education
- Received, read and considered over 1,000 letters from the public

EVENTS TO BE PROUD OF.....



Once again, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the annual **Recognition Reception for Years of Service & New Employees**, as well as the annual **Retirement Dinner**, were not held in person.

The long-service recognition of 1 employee for 40 years of service, 26 employees for 30 years of service, and 45 employees for 20 years of service was acknowledged by providing each employee with a Certificate and pin.

CAPITAL PROJECTS.....



- Reopened École Bellevue Creek Elementary School for Kindergarten and Grade 1 English and French Immersion
 - Change in English catchment area for Okanagan Mission Family of Schools
- Received capital funding for new Westside Secondary School
 - Students at École George Pringle Elementary School move to Webber Road Elementary School (English), École Glenrosa Elementary School (French Immersion), and École Hudson Road Elementary School (French Immersion)
 - Change in elementary French Immersion catchment areas
- Purchased property in the Wilden area for a future school site
- École Dr. Knox Middle School addition in progress

Health and Safety

- Our Health and Safety Department managed claims for 32 School Districts in the Province
- Revenue totaling \$302,099.73 is obtained through three sources:
 - Claims Management Shared Services net \$119,179
 - 2. Online Safety Courses net \$21,200
 - 3. COR Safety Audit net \$161,720.73



International Education

 For the 2021/2022 school year, it is anticipated that the International Education Program will collect revenues of \$6.2M with 553 students (422 FTE) coming from 25 countries and jurisdictions.



MANAGING THE VOLUME OF CHANGE WITHIN THE SYSTEM.....



- The Human Resources Department processed (as of June 15th):
 - 487 support staff postings
 - 257 teacher postings during the Spring staffing period
 - 68 Senior staff, Principal, Vice-Principal and management changes (retirements, resignations, appointments and reassignments)
 - 195 new Teachers Teaching on Call (TTOC) hired
- During the 2021/2022 school year, the Board concluded the selection process for the following senior staff and management positions:
