REFLECTIVE ACTIVITIES


The education students experience should reflect the diversity of the community in which they live, and whenever possible they should see themselves reflected in the lessons and materials.



Themes of diversity, acceptance, and inclusion are embedded throughout all subjects in the curriculum, and they can be woven into cross-curricular activities.

TRY OUT SOME INCLUSIVE PRACTICES

Strategy 1: Use Multiple Formats



Use different types of resources to honour the diversity of the students in your class: magazines, videos, websites, blogs, newspapers, audiobooks.

Strategy 2: Vary the Response Format



Let students show what they know through various means: music, painting portraits, acting out scenes, audio recordings.

Strategy 3: Use Flexible Grouping



Research shows that using partners and small groups create higher engagement levels and help students maintain attention.



Love Letter




