460.2R – APPEALS (REGULATIONS)

APPEALS RELATED TO STUDENT PLACEMENT

If possible, an appeal related to a student placement should be resolved at the school level in accordance with Policy 405: Student Placement, using the following procedure.

If a resolution cannot be reached at that level, Appeals Bylaw Form 460 may be used to initiate an appeal to the Board of Education.

Procedure:

- 1. Decisions relating to capping of a class, school or program are made by the Superintendent of Schools or designate.
- 2. Appeals against such decisions should initially be made to the Superintendent or designate who made the decision.
- 3. If a resolution cannot be reached, the Superintendent or designate shall invite the appellant to appeal to the Board.
- 4. Decisions relating to student transfer requests are made by the principal of the receiving school.
- 5. Appeals against such decisions should initially be made to the principal who made the decision.
- 6. If a resolution cannot be reached at that level, the decision may be appealed to the Superintendent or designate.
- 7. If a resolution cannot be reached, the Superintendent or designate shall invite the appellant to appeal to the Board.
- 8. An appeal to the Board regarding a decision on either capping or a student transfer request may be made by the parents/guardians of the student within fifteen school days of receiving the Superintendent's decision.
