I want to add my voice of disappointment to the Board's decision to issue this statement.

Generally, I believe the statement issued was an overreaction, and overreach, into the political realm, and I disagree with many of the assertions contained within it.

There are controversial opinions being expressed in your statement that undermine my confidence of public education. I do not believe there is "systemic....and ongoing racism" in this country. The great country of Canada was built by imperfect men and women, but what they left behind was a standard of living and way of life that was the envy of most of the world. Your Board represents and gives direction to the educators that are weighing into the political arena and seem determined to tear the nation apart as an unintended consequence.

When I see statues of Sir John A. Macdonald being toppled or over 100 churches burned to the ground, I believe statements like the one you issued are fueling division in this
