

Chairperson's Annual Report November 23, 2011







- Introduction of the Full Day Kindergarten initiative in all 30 elementary schools including the:
 - addition of 15 modular classrooms
 - construction of an 8 classroom addition to Shannon Lake Elementary
 - re-opening of Anne McClymont Primary (K-1)
 - Consultation processes regarding the:
 - French Immersion Program
 - future of grade 7s in the Mission and Lake Country Schools
 - adoption of a common secondary school timetable
 - establishment of the 'Attributes of our Learners'







- Hiring 77 new Teachers and 83 Support Staff members
- Establishing an Instructional Leadership Team
- Completing 27 Principal and Vice-Principal changes through a combination of retirements, resignations, appointments and reassignments
- Adding a new StrongStart Centre in Peachland
- Expanding the International Education Program from 120 to 180 students
- Adding 10 new Board Authorized Courses and 1 new Academy
- Revising 25 Board Policies and introducing 5 new Policies







- Reviewed 4 District Education Programs
- Expanded the Health & Safety Department to manage claims for 24 of the 60 School Districts in B.C.
- · Raised in excess of \$200,000 in support of local and global causes
- Signed a 5 year Local Education Agreement with the Westbank First Nation





Highlights of achievements within the major goal areas:

- Reducing levels of vulnerability within the primary student population from 16% exiting at risk at the end of grade 3 in 2009 to 12% exiting at risk in 2011
- Aboriginal Graduation Rate increased from 60% to 61%
 - (compared to 54.1% for the Province)
- Graduation Rate increased from 84.7% to 86.2% (compared to 80.3% for the Province)
- During this Board's 3 Year Term, the District's Graduation Rate has risen from 82.9% to 86.2%





- Sent 79 letters advocating on behalf of public education
- Submitted one resolution to BCPSEA and three Motions to BCSTA
- Secured capital funding of approximately \$30 million for the construction of a new elementary school on Rosewood Drive and an addition to Okanagan Mission Secondary School





- As Chairperson of the Board I would like to recognize members of our local community for their support of public education.
- I would also like to specifically acknowledge the hard work, leadership and dedication of:
 - our official partner groups;
 - · members of senior staff; and
 - my fellow trustees.
