PUBLIC QUESTION/COMMENT PERIOD

Rebecca Robinson: Ms. Robinson queried why the District is preparing for functional closures instead of closing schools, similar to other provinces.

The Superintendent of Schools/CEO stated that schools in B.C. will not be closed. If staff and students are sick, they must stay home, this may result in functional closures due to a number of staff away sick. Functional closures will be determined on a school by school, situation by situation basis.

Karry Hardy-Guarducci: Ms. Hardy-Guarducci expressed concern with the encouragement of vaccinations and queried why there is a push for vaccinations.

The Board Chair stated that the District is following provincial guidelines to encourage vaccinations and the Board of Education passed a motion to encourage vaccinations in all eligible people.

Karry Hardy-Guarducci: Ms. Hardy-Guarducci queried if children will be mandated to have vaccines.

The Board Chair stated that mandating vaccinations for children would fall under the provincial government's purview. There has never been mandates for children regarding any other vaccine.

Brian Banman: Mr. Banman queried if the Board is still considering a vaccine mandate for teachers.

The Board Chair stated that the Board of Education has requested all staff to confirm their vaccination status and will use this information to inform the Board on how they move forward with a potential vaccine mandate.

Michelle Rentke: Ms. Rentke expressed concerns about discrimination based on vaccination status and requested that the Board of Education look into the legal ramifications for imposing a vaccine mandate.

The Board Chair stated that the Board of Education is considering all information, from all points of view.

Tovey Demman: Ms. Demman expressed concerns regarding the mental health of students since the return to school this January.

The Board Chair acknowledged that stricter protocols in schools may be negatively affecting students. However, the Provincial Health Officer and Ministry of Education have issued the guidelines that school districts must follow.

The Superintendent of Schools/CEO acknowledged that mental health for students and staff is a concern and recommended that students and/or parents speak to their school counsellor or Principal/Vice-Principal with concerns.

Breanna Snow: Ms. Snow queried what the Board's intention is regarding teachers' vaccination status.

The Board Chair stated that the Board of Education is hoping that 100% of staff provide their vaccination status to inform their decision on whether to implement a vaccine mandate.

Geoff Snicer: Mr. Snicer queried if the Board of Education has done a risk/reward analysis regarding how the COVID-19 protocols are affecting students.

The Board Chair stated that each Trustee has done their own research and will have their own opinion.
