1. Glenrosa Middle School – Japan Exchange

2018 Sister School Scholarship Exchange

Tanner Donaldson and Lexi Lewis were the Glenrosa Middle School representatives for this year's Glenrosa Middle School/Constable Neil Bruce Middle/Haruhigaoka Sister School Exchange. They traveled with two students from Constable Neil Bruce Middle to Kasugai, to spend a week in Japan, living in a Japanese home and attending school with their host billets. During this time, they attended classes and school activities.

2018 Haruhigaoka Global Meeting

Bella Cotton and Aiyana Bremner were the representatives for the 2018 Haruhigaoka Global Meeting based around the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals. They presented their school projects, and participated in a conference with high school students from around the Pacific Rim. They made 3 presentations:

- 1. Our Life in Canada was presented to more than 1600 staff, students and guests at the high school.
- 2. Glenrosa Middle School Sustainability Projects was presented at Chubu University to hundreds of staff and students from the high school and university, prominent business leaders, and guests.
- 3. The students also worked in a collaborative group with students from all participating countries to create a multi-national presentation on sustainability.

Bella and Aiyana presented the Sustainability Development Goals for Glenrosa Middle School.

Recognition:

1. Renay Willier, Grade 10, Mount Boucherie Secondary School

The Board of Education congratulated Renay Willier for being the recipient of the Premier's Award for Indigenous Youth Excellence in Sport at the Interior Premier's Awards Celebration Banquet held in November. Renay was the recipient of this award for her outstanding sport achievement, her commitment and dedication to education, culture, leadership and community.

1. Human Rights Month

The Central Okanagan Board of Education declared the month of February 2019 as Human Rights Month in Central Okanagan Public Schools.

Presentations:

1. BC Tripartite Education Agreement (BCTEA)

Presenter: Terry-Lee Beaudry, Deputy Superintendent

The Deputy Superintendent provided an overview of the BC Tripartite Education Agreement. The BCTEA parties are: BC First Nations – The First Nations Education Steering Committee; The Government of Canada – Indigenous Services Canada; and the Province of British Columbia – The Ministry of Education. The Tripartite Agreement is for all First Nations students who are on the nominal roll. The BCTEA is intended to promote systemic shifts and collective efforts that will support improved educational outcomes for First Nation students in BC, regardless of where they are enrolled in school.

2. New BC Graduation Program

Presenter: Vianne Kintzinger, Assistant Superintendent

The Assistant Superintendent presented on the new BC Graduation Program. This new program will support students through their final years of high school. The Assistant Superintendent's presentation reviewed "What Has Changed" and "What Is Staying the Same". Action Items:

1. Rebuttal Letter to Minister R. Fleming Re: Rutland Middle School

The Board of Education agreed to send a rebuttal letter to Minister R. Fleming's letter dated January 3, 2019, regarding the replacement of Rutland Middle School (RMS). The letter will emphasize:

- that RMS is not only an aging structure but is also supporting significant growth in the area resulting in 10 portables on site (40% of the student population utilizes these portables throughout the day)
- that there are continued challenges with maintaining a 70 year old facility within the Annual Facilities Grant Envelope
- that there are ongoing accessibility issues for all students that attend the school

2. Rutland Middle School Projects – 2019/2020 Annual Facilities Grant Submission

The Board of Education gave priority to Rutland Middle School Minor Capital Projects for washroom additions, roofing improvements and mechanical upgrades when developing the 2019-2020 Annual Facilities Grant Submission.
