## **Recognition/Presentations/Delegations**

## 1. Central Programs and Services: Alternate Pathways to Graduation

Curtis Schreiber, Principal, and Randy Horne, Vice-Principal, Central Programs and Services, presented on Central Programs and Services' alternate pathways to graduation. Central Programs and Services provides schooling for students from kindergarten to grade 12 who may be vulnerable or at-risk, typically have not experienced success, and/or need more flexibility in their education program that cannot be reached in traditional school settings. Central Programs and Services focuses on 4 pillars based on the Medicine Wheel (To <u>build confidence</u>, foster a <u>supportive environment</u>, provide <u>alternative paths</u>, and foster <u>optimism</u>). The Program offers three major program or service options: Alternative Education Programs and Services, Adult Education to Graduation, and Distributed Learning (eSchool). Students may graduate with one of the following certificates: Graduation (Dogwood Diploma), Adult Graduation Diploma, and School Completion (Evergreen). As of May 1, 2015, the Ministry of Education will discontinue funding to school districts for graduates pursuing to upgrade courses.

#### **Outcome**

The Committee recommended that the Board of Education write a letter to the Ministry of Education regarding their decision to discontinue funding for graduated adults.

#### **Discussion/Information Items**

## 1. Aboriginal Education Program Annual Report

Kevin Kaiser, Aboriginal Education Curriculum Resource Teacher, reviewed the 11<sup>th</sup> Annual Aboriginal Education Program Report. The four goals of the Central Okanagan School District's second Aboriginal Enhancement Agreement, reflecting the teachings of the Medicine Wheel (Emotional, Spiritual, Intellectual, and Physical) and the 40 Developmental Assets®, were highlighted. The Program has seen an increase in student leadership with Aboriginal students taking lead roles in various Aboriginal Programs and District events. The Aboriginal Education Programs' six-year completion rate for the 2013/2014 school year marked a milestone achievement of 73%. The Aboriginal Education Program will continue to focus on the goals of the District's second Enhancement Agreement, with a 90% graduation (Dogwood) target for Aboriginal students by 2019.

## 1. K-12 Assessment Policy/Plan Update

Terry-Lee Beaudry, Assistant Superintendent, shared that the District Assessment Committee is near completion of the draft Assessment Policy. The draft policy will be provided to the Ad Hoc Policy Committee for review in the spring, prior to the policy going forward to the Board of Education for approval. Following completion of the Assessment Policy, the District Assessment Committee will focus on the K-12 Assessment Plan.
