Recognition/Presentations/Delegations

1. Proposal for French Immersion Course – Perspectives Mondiales

Armelle Moran and Alexandra Light, Teachers from Kelowna Secondary School, presented the concept of developing a French Immersion course called Perspectives Mondiales. This course would include unique opportunities to improve fluency in French, community work, as well as provide students with the opportunity to develop an awareness of global issues. The possibility of organizing a Humanitarian Trip within a French speaking community is also being considered.

The Committee discussed the potential benefit of providing an additional elective course to French Immersion students and provided feedback to assist in the development of the future Board/Authority Authorized (BAA) Course Proposal.

Discussion/Action Item

1. Proposal for Substantive Change – Okanagan Mission Secondary Golf Academy

Leanne Zorn, Principal, and Paul Janke, Teacher, from Okanagan Mission Secondary School, presented on the proposal to establish a Golf Academy at Okanagan Mission Secondary School. The Okanagan Mission Secondary Golf Academy is intended for students in grades 9-12, of any skill level, and will be offered in the spring semester of each school year. The Okanagan Golf Club and instructors from the Canadian Professional Golf Association (CPGA) will support the Academy. The total cost for the Academy is \$975 per student, which includes over 100 hours of CPGA professional instruction, Central Okanagan School District transportation, and fifteen 9-hole rounds of golf at a local golf course.

Outcome

The Committee recommended that the Board of Education approve the Proposal for Substantive Change – Okanagan Mission Secondary Golf Academy, as attached to the Agenda, and as presented at the May 4, 2016 Education and Student Services Committee Meeting.

2. Proposal for Substantive Change – George Elliot Secondary Dance Academy

Kathy Weninger, Principal, and Deanne Collinson, Teacher, from George Elliot Secondary, provided background information on the George Elliot Secondary Dance Academy proposal. The George Elliot Secondary Dance Academy would enable students to continue to develop their love of dance, improving their general health, skill level, and appreciation for this art form. In addition, students will have an opportunity to engage in the creative exploration of choreography. The total cost for the Academy is \$225 per student, which includes professional instruction, access to a dance studio, equipment, and costumes.

Outcome

The Committee recommended that the Board of Education approve the Proposal for Substantive Change – George Elliot Secondary Dance Academy, as attached to the Agenda, and as presented at the May 4, 2016 Education and Student Services Committee Meeting.
