Human Library events were first developed in Europe to allow readers to meet with people from diverse backgrounds in an effort to break down stereotypes and prejudices. In a 21st Century Learning environment, Human Library events also reinforce the role of a library as a Learning Commons, an important place to bring diverse people together to provide meaningful social action among students and community members. Students will be given the opportunity to hear diverse stories, and converse with a wide variety of community members. Human Library volunteers are essentially living books that can be borrowed by KLO readers for a set period of time (15-20 minutes) to engage in conversation. Thank you to the many parents and community members who have volunteered to participate in this worthwhile event.
