Discussion/Action Items

1. New Policy 168 – Policy Committee

At the Incamera Board of Education meeting held on Wednesday, November 30, 2016, the Board of Education agreed to form a new Board Standing Committee - Policy Committee starting January of 2017. Policy 140 - School Board Standing and Ad Hoc Committees states:

Composition, Scope and Function "2.4

> The composition, scope and function of each Standing Committee shall be established in a separate Policy for each Committee."

Each Board Standing Committee will continue to be responsible to "review and evaluate all policies pertaining to the (name of Committee) function at least once every three years" as stated in all Board Standing Committee Policies. The Coordinating Committee will determine the process for new, amended or affirmed Policies from Committees on whether they will be forwarded directly to the Board for approval or to the Policy Committee for further review.

The Board of Education approve new Policy 168 – Policy Committee as attached to the Agenda and as presented at the January 4, 2017 Public Policy Committee Meeting.

2. Start Time for Future Policy Committee Meetings

3. Amendments to Policy 387 – Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy

The suggested amendments to Policy 387 – Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy are to align the Policy to meet the requirements under the WorkSafe Bulletin issued in May of 2013. These amendments include the addition of information on "Requirements Related to Student Privacy and Worker Health and Safety". The Workers Compensation Act requires that employers inform their workers about all known or reasonably foreseeable health and safety hazards, including workplace violence. The disclosure of personal information within an organization is allowed by FOIPPA "if the information is immediately necessary for the protection of the health or safety of the...employee". Disclosure is required if the answer is 'yes' to the question "Is disclosing this information necessary to help protect this worker's safety?"

Trustee Tiede was nominated as an Acting Committee Member in place of Trustee Baxter.

The Committee discussed the addition of further contents of the WorkSafe Bulletin.

The Board of Education approve the amendments to Policy 387 – Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy as attached to the Agenda and as amended at the January 4, 2017 Public Policy Committee Meeting.

4. Draft Rewrite of Policy 515 – Family Life Education Program

The Committee discussed the contents of the draft rewrite of Policy 515 – Family Life Education Program and specifically which portions would form the development of an Admin Procedure. The Admin Procedure will contain information on the operation of the Family Life Education Program.
