



Thank you From the SKE Office

We recently sent home information about late arrivals, mid-day departures, and early dismissals.

Thank you families, for reading our letter. We appreciate how quickly we noticed that these important safety procedures were being followed. This helps us ensure accurate attendance, and reduces classroom and learning interruptions.

As a brief reminder:

<u>Late Arrivals</u>

- Teachers take classroom attendance promptly after the morning and afternoon bells.
- If your student is arriving after 8:30 am, they must stop at the office to sign in. This is an essential part of ensuring we have accounted for all of our students.

<u> Mid-Day Departures/Item Drop Off</u>

- When a child is being picked up early, parents/caregivers must come to the school office to let us know they are here.
- Parents/caregivers can wait in the office and school staff will ensure your student is notified or brought down.
- If an item needs to be dropped off for a student, please leave it at the office. We will be sure that it makes its way to the right person.

Updates on Parking & Parking Safety

South Kelowna families are very fortunate to have options for dropping off and picking up their children at school. Thank you for taking care of our community by being mindful of, and following the parking lot expectations. Your modeling for our students makes a huge difference!

Thank you for:

- Using the paved pathways and crosswalks at all times rather than cutting through the parking lot and bus lane.
- Obeying ALL NO PARKING signs. Busses require clearance to enter and exit safely. This ensures the safety of all vehicles entering and exiting the school grounds.
- Keeping our neighbor's driveways open so they can access or exit their homes.

Drop Off & Pick Up:

<u>Spiers Road</u>: ** <u>BEST OPTION</u> ** If dropping off on the school side (West), please be sure child(ren) **exit the right-hand side** of the vehicle directly onto the sidewalk. Please follow signage—do not park past the tall cedars as it makes it very difficult for busses to exit. If dropping off on the far side of the road (East), please park your car and <u>escort your child(ren) across the</u> road.

<u>Bus Loop</u>: *DROP OFF ONLY AFTER 8:10 a.m.* You may use the bus loop to drop off after the busses have left <u>after 8:10</u> a.m. If dropping off in the bus loop, please be sure your child(ren) exit the right-hand side of the vehicle directly onto the sidewalk. This avoids children going around vehicles and being in the line of passing cars. <u>Do not leave your vehicle</u> while utilizing the bus loop.

<u>Staff Parking Lot</u>: <u>The parking lot is for STAFF only. Staff in various roles need to access the parking lot throughout the day, including those arriving for after-school activities.</u>

The Universal Declaration of Human Rights is a historic document which outlined the rights and freedoms everyone is entitled to.

In December of 1995, the Parliament of Canada recognized February as Black History Month following a motion introduced by the first African Canadian woman elected to Parliament, Jean Augustine. Waste Free Lunches

Save \$\$\$!

Reusable <u>pouches like these</u> (or similar) will save you money on yogurt/applesauce when you buy the larger containers while saving the planet every lunch hour! Ditch the single use plastic!

Skip the ziploc with these (or similar) snack pouches.

Send reusable cutlery, especially on hot lunch days. Here is one option for a <u>cutlery</u> set with a neat container for lunch kits

When no waste isn't an option, consider low waste, plastic free options. Our time is precious, so it can be challenging to resist pre-packaged, single serve snacks but if we all keep the idea of reducing plastic consumption in mind, we can make a difference in the waste we produce as a school while saving money on groceries at home!





Is your child too sick for school?



Deciding when your child is too sick for school is not always an easy decision.

Children should not come to school if they are sick and unable to participate fully in routine activities. If you have questions and concerns about your child's health, talk with a qualified healthcare professional.

Keep children at home if they have:

- . a fever, and keep them home for 24 hours after the fever is gone away without the help of medication (see reverse page on how to take a temperature).
- · vomiting or diarrhea, and keep them home for 48 hours after the last episode.
- · a severe sore throat.
- · a rash with no known cause.
- · a severe cough especially with other symptoms like a runny nose and headache.
- · redness, swelling or discharge of the eyes, ears or skin, unless treated.
- · been acting unwell and have little energy to join in school activities.

For questions about your child's health you can:

- 1. Dial 811 or go to HealthLinkBC.ca to speak with a:
- · Registered Nurse 24 hours a day, every day of the year.
- · Registered Dietitian every weekday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. PST.
- · Pharmacist every night from 5 p.m. to 9 a.m. PST every day of the year.
- 2. Contact an Urgent Care, Walk-in Clinic or Doctor's Office.

Is it an Emergency?

Having a sick child can be stressful, but not all illnesses require a visit to the emergency department. Find the right place to go for care.

- · Difficulty breathing
- · Fever in infants younger than 3 months



- · Serious or severe burn
- · Vomiting or diarrhea with dehydration
- · Sudden change in mental

· Complicated or deep cut
