RECOGNITION/PRESENTATION/DELEGATIONS

Numeracy Update

Jon Rever, Acting Deputy Superintendent of Schools, Jordan Kleckner, Director of Instruction – Learning and Innovation, and District Teacher Consultants Jennifer Davis and Kevin Dent from the Learning and Innovation Team presented on the District's priority to focus on improving students' foundational skills in numeracy across all grade levels. The presentation involved a hands-on activity designed to simulate the innovative numeracy learning experience of students in the classroom, involving teamwork, logical reasoning, analytical thought, fun and creative thinking.

The analysis of provincial assessment data, indicating students' proficiency in numeracy, supports the District's priority to focus on improving students' foundational skills in numeracy across all grade levels. In the 2024/2025 school year, the District will enhance assessment and support for students in priority populations to reduce performance differences. In addition, the District will focus numeracy development efforts on all students in middle and secondary schools with particular attention on students in priority populations.

The District has developed robust student achievement data systems to continuously track, monitor, and report on the numeracy development of each child as they progress from kindergarten to grade twelve. The District recognizes that students' numeracy proficiency has been lower than provincial averages for several years and has become an area of focus for school administrators and classroom teachers. There have been significant investments in District numeracy support teams, teacher professional development, STEM related opportunities, the Middle School Numeracy Assessment pilot, and numeracy assessment resources, which represents the District's commitment to numeracy development for all students in grades K to 12.
