SAFER SCHOOLS TOGETHER

WATER BOTTLES & UTENSILS

Please send a water bottle and utensils with your child to school every day. We do not provide these items anymore.

Supervision is provided AFTER 8:10 a.m. and ENDS at 2:45 p.m.

Students must leave the school grounds by 2:45 p.m., unless they are with a parent. Students are to report home after supervision is over at 2:45 p.m., and then the student may return to play, if a parent gives them permission.

Please be reminded that unless the weather is extreme, students are expected to wait outside until the morning bell rings and they are expected to go outside for some fresh air at break time. <u>Please ensure your children are dressed for the weather!</u>

SAFETY REMINDERS

Unlike many schools, we have options for dropping off students in the morning. However, with vehicles coming and going from so many directions, this can increase safety concerns. By taking a few extra minutes in the morning and noting the following safety rules, we can ensure safer access for students.

BUS LOOP: If dropping off in the bus loop, please be sure your child(ren) exit the right-hand side of the vehicle directly onto the sidewalk. This avoids children going around vehicles and being in the line of passing cars.

SPIERS ROAD: If dropping off on the school side (West), please be sure child(ren) exit the right-hand side of the vehicle directly onto the sidewalk. If dropping off on the far side of the road (East), please park your car and escort your child(ren) across the road.

PARKING LOT: The Staff Parking lot is for **STAFF ONLY.** Please do not park in the staff parking lot during the day.

A few things that continue to be a concern:

- · Parents stopping in the middle of the parking lot instead of using the bus loop or surrounding parking areas
- · Cars passing each other in the parking lot
- Parents ignoring the no parking signs along the road, restricting vision for cars exiting the parking lot
- · Cars blocking the handicapped parking and sidewalk accesses
- Parents using the restricted bus turn-around as a parking area, passing, blocking and congesting the exit.
- · Parents blocking and parking in neighboring driveways

OUTDOOR EXPECTATIONS

Please be reminded that unless the weather is extreme, students are expected to wait outside until the morning bell rings and they are expected to go outside for some fresh air at break time. Please ensure your children are dressed for the weather!

We have been discussing the following winter playground expectations with our students. Please review:

- Throwing or kicking snow is not acceptable as it may cause injury to another student.
- Sliding is allowed on the South back field only.
- Students should be wearing snow pants to slide. Wood or metal sliders are not allowed. Soft, plastic or vinyl sliders only!
- Students should wait until the sliders in front of them are out of the way before sliding.
- Students should walk up the hill away from the sliding area.
- Only those students with sliders should be in the sliding area.
- Only one person per slider is allowed. No pairs or groups together.
- Students must slide on their knees or bottom and face forward.
- No standing or sliding on stomach.

Supervision is provided after 8:10 am in the morning and until 2:45 pm in the afternoon.

Students should not be on the playground outside those times without a parent.


PAC INFO

THE MIDDLE YEARS DEVELOPMENT INSTRUMENT (MDI) IS COMING TO YOUR SCHOOL IN JANUARY/FEBRUARY!

School District 23 has partnered with the Human Early Learning Partnership (HELP) at the University of British Columbia to measure and promote children's social and emotional development, health, well-being, and assets through the Middle Year Development Instrument (MDI). The Middle Years Development Instrument (MDI) is a self-report questionnaire that asks children in middle childhood about their thoughts, feelings and experiences. The MDI is the first survey of its kind to gather information about the lives of children both in school, in the home and in the community, from their own perspective. The survey questions align with the BC Ministry of Education's K-12 curriculum, which includes a focus on promoting children's personal and social competencies.

Grade 5 students are invited to complete the MDI during class time between: January 10th and March 3rd, 2023.
