## **Harmony Day and Human Rights Month - 2015**

Leigh-Ann Yanow, Chair - Harmony Day Committee, reviewed the various events planned and resources available for this year's Harmony Day.

The Board Chair made the following Declaration:

#### School Bus Safety Week - February 2 through to February 6, 2015

The Board Chair made the following Declaration:

THAT: The Board of Education of School District No. 23 (Central Okanagan) declares the week of February 2 through to February 6, 2015 as "School Bus Safety Week" in the Central Okanagan School District, supporting the theme "2015: Bully Free Zone!".

#### **Presentation: District School Planning Council Meetings**

Background information was provided on the legislation pertaining to School Planning Councils which became law on July 1, 2002. School Planning Councils are advisory bodies, responsible for developing, monitoring, and reviewing school plans for student achievement in consultation with the school community. The Board of Education maintains policies and procedures to support School Planning Councils.

Annual meetings with School Planning Councils include the Liaison Trustee, either the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent, the zonal Director of Instruction, school staff, and student and parent representatives. Discussion at the annual meeting includes current and future school goals, structures in place to support the goals, and evidence that school goals are improving learning. Dates for this year's School Planning Council Meetings will be set in the near future.

## TRUSTEES QUERIES/COMMENTS

All trustees were provided with an opportunity to comment on their involvement, since the previous Board meeting, in District activities.

## **Trustee Fraser**

Provided information regarding an initiative undertaken by the Board of Education of School District No. 67 (Okanagan Skaha), who, in an effort to investigate relief from rising utility rates, met with the Penticton Mayor and Council to discuss electricity rates and the impact the rising costs are having on funding for education. Their school district also uses reclaimed water for sports field irrigation which provides significant cost savings.

The Acting Secretary-Treasurer responded that the Central Okanagan School District has been able to maintain its utility budget for the past seven years, due to facility retrofits, installation of cost-effective lighting systems, etc., and by continually working with arborists to ensure the most efficient watering procedures are strictly adhered to.

The Superintendent advised that the District's Energy & Sustainability Manager is diligent in pursuing all avenues of utility efficiencies in order to ensure rising utility rates have the least amount of financial impact as possible.

*NOTE:* At the February 18, 2015 Planning and Facilities Committee Meeting, the Energy & Sustainability Manager will be providing a presentation on energy and sustainability initiatives.

## **Timing of the Rutland Grade Configuration**

THAT: The Board of Education approve the Superintendent's recommendation to implement the grade configuration change to Rutland area schools as per Board Motion 12P-089 for September 2015. (This will result in elementary schools being Kindergarten to grade 5, middle schools being grades 6 to 8, and secondary schools being grades 9 to 12.)

Trustee Fraser, Chair of the Planning and Facilities Committee, provided information on the Rutland Grade Configuration as discussed at the committee level. Approximately 700 families provided input on the proposed grade configuration and community feedback has been supportive. Trustees discussed the grade configuration, its effect on elementary, middle and secondary school enrolment, and the possible future closing of an elementary school in the Rutland area should enrolment continue to decline.

Shelley Courtney, COPAC member, queried whether there is an opportunity for parents to provide feedback on the capital budget.

The Chairperson responded that capital budget discussions occur at the school level, where principals request input from their Parent Advisory Council, the School Planning Council, staff, parents and students.

The Superintendent advised that distribution of Annual Facility Grant funds is determined by management staff through a thorough review and prioritization of all school improvement requests received.

## Learning Improvement Fund (LIF) Distribution for the 2015-2016 School Year

- Senior staff and members of the Central Okanagan Teachers' Association (COTA) Executive have had their first meeting to discuss how best to distribute the Learning Improvement Fund resources in support of classrooms and vulnerable students.
- A sizable LIF allocation will be received for the 2015-2016 school year which will fund approximately 33 teaching positions throughout the school district.
