Nicholas Reitsma

- Nicholas is a 2nd year pre-med student at UBC Okanagan and has been involved with the Foundry's mental health movement.
- Growing up, Nicholas suffered from depression, and fortunately had a supportive family that was able to get him the help he needed.
- Maintaining his mental health became challenging when he moved away from his family to attend university. Nicholas found many professional resources that enabled him to cope and find ways to apply the skills he learned.

- Suffering from depression at university resulted in Nicholas becoming
 involved in the "Not Alone" campaign. Many students attending school,
 away from their families, or on their own need reassurance that they are not
 alone, and that it is not a sign of weakness to talk about their depression,
 anxieties and situation.
- Vianne will put him in touch with schools.

6.1 Presentations and Workshop

6.1 a. Looking back:

- <u>February 16th</u> Youth Mental Health Summit @ The Rotary Centre for the Arts. All middle and secondary schools brought students to hear Orlando Bowen, inspirational speaker. Students were empowered to return to schools and support mental health week at their schools. During breakout sessions, students had opportunity to share through a student panel. Okanagan Skaha School District also attended.
 - Thank you to COTA for funds to provide TTOC's so teachers could attend.
- <u>February 23rd</u> Employee Wellness Symposium at Dr. Knox for all of our staff. Dr .Ty Binfet started the day as the keynote speaker, along with his dog Francis.
- March 1st MDI Presentation to Public Health Nurses, at their new office in downtown Kelowna. Discussed community connections. Current Grade 4 MDI data was just sent to the schools.
- March 1st Resource sharing about the Physical Health Education curriculum at Springvalley Elementary School.
- <u>April 4th</u> Student Leadership Workshop at Hudson Road Elementary involved Grade 5 games and active outside play. A fun day of training.
- "Kids in the Know" classroom support at AS Matheson Elementary this is the personal safety portion of Personal Health and Education. Kits were delivered to schools in Fall 2017 and are geared for Kindergarten to Grade 9.
- Collaborative Learning Services (CLS) Tricia and Janelle working on-site with South Rutland Elementary in kindergarten classrooms, and facilitating lessons at Casorso Elementary.
- Breakfast Program Support for Food for Thought and Hope for the Nations.
 Also started a pilot of the backpack program at AS Matheson Elementary, in partnership with the United Way, for students that need food for the weekend. The students are able to make choices out of each food category.
