DISTRICT RECEIVES APPROVAL FOR SIX ADDITIONAL CHILDCARE CENTRES

May 25, 2021

KELOWNA, BC – The Provincial government announced funding for six childcare centres on Central Okanagan Public Schools lands:

- The Clubhouse at Ellison Elementary School: \$3 million for 71 licensed childcare spaces
- Okanagan Boys and Girls Club North Glenmore Elementary School: \$3 million for 92 licensed childcare spaces
- Okanagan YMCA Okanagan Mission Secondary School: \$3 million for 82 licensed childcare spaces
- Okanagan Boys and Girls Club Anne McClymont Elementary School: \$3 million for 82 licensed childcare spaces
- Okanagan YMCA Black Mountain Elementary School Child Care: \$3 million for 82 licensed childcare spaces
- Okanagan Boys and Girls Club Hudson Road Elementary School: \$3 million for 92 licensed childcare spaces

In addition to the spaces and funding announced last year for the program currently being constructed at George Elliot Secondary School, this represents \$21 million and 602 total childcare spaces to serve this vital community need.

"The Board of Education is extremely appreciative of the Provincial Government's support of this valuable service that benefits families in our communities" says Board Chair, Moyra Baxter, "The Central Okanagan is the fasting growing community in British Columbia and creating new spaces for our children to be cared for and to learn is essential."

The District is currently in the design phase and the centres are expected to be fully constructed by September 2023.
