RECOGNITION/PRESENTATION/DELEGATIONS

Summer Literacy Camp 2022

Jamie Robinson, Assistant Superintendent, shared that, building on the success of the Summer Literacy Camp in 2021, Central Okanagan Public Schools will be offering a Summer Literacy Camp 2022 for students currently in grades 1 to 4 who would benefit from more time and more practice with specific areas of their educational experience. In consultation with school teams, it is believed that continued support over the summer has the potential to reduce summer learning loss while fostering growth in foundational skill building (literacy and numeracy), social/emotional learning, and learner self-confidence. The play-based Literacy Summer Camps will provide targeted and personalized intervention and will operate from Monday July 4th to Friday, July 15th as regional hubs for schools in Rutland, Lake Country, Central/Mission, and the Westside. Host schools will be Springvalley Elementary, École Peter Greer Elementary, Raymer Elementary, and Hudson Road Elementary with approximately 225 children invited to participate in the program. At the end of the Literacy Camp, each child will receive a take-home package including library books and books to keep, and, in addition, educators will check in with students throughout the summer.

DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS

Board/Authority Authorized (BAA) Course Proposals – Mountain Biking 10, 11, and 12

Scott Sieben, Principal - Mount Boucherie Secondary School, and Julian Green, Teacher - Mount Boucherie Secondary School, presented the proposals for Board/Authority Authorized (BAA) courses — Mountain Biking 10, 11, and 12. These courses have been designed to introduce students to the sport of mountain biking and help them develop their personal fitness, technical and tactical skills, teamwork and communication, and an understanding of their role in the natural environment. The program will give students the opportunity to follow a passion for the outdoors, which will hopefully be part of a healthy lifestyle into their future.

Outcome:

The Committee recommended that the Board of Education approve the Board/Authority Authorized (BAA) Course Proposals, Mountain Biking 10, 11, and 12 (Mount Boucherie Secondary School), as attached to the Agenda, and as presented at the June 15, 2022 Education and Student Services Committee Meeting.

<u>Proposal for Substantive Change – Mountain Biking Academy (Mount Boucherie Secondary School)</u>

Scott Sieben, Principal - Mount Boucherie Secondary School, and Julian Green, Teacher - Mount Boucherie Secondary School, presented a Proposal for Substantive Change – Mountain Biking Academy (Mount Boucherie Secondary School). The Mountain Biking Academy will allow students to participate in a sport in which they are an integral part of a team and experience the benefits of team sports, such as having a coach, teammates and a network of support and camaraderie. The Academy will include a variety of drills and mini-rides to help develop aspects of trail riding and navigation. Nutrition, personal planning, and the relationship between athletics and academic achievement will be considered as a part of an overall healthy lifestyle. Students will also take part in goal setting and reflection activities using technology and data collection.

The Mountain Biking Academy is designed to develop mountain biking skills and knowledge up to an advanced level, supporting and developing the individual as a person and athlete while connecting them to the mountain biking community and building individual confidence in life.

Outcome:

The Committee recommended that the Board of Education approve the Proposal for Substantive Change – Mountain Biking Academy (Mount Boucherie Secondary School), as attached to the Agenda, and as presented at the June 15, 2022 Education and Student Services Committee Meeting.

Board/Authority Authorized (BAA) Course Proposal – Parks and Recreation 12

Derek Lea, Principal - Okanagan Mission Secondary School, Amber Otke, Teacher - Okanagan Mission Secondary School, and Kirsten Mulleny, Teacher - Okanagan Mission Secondary School, presented the Board/Authority Authorized (BAA) Course Proposal for Parks and Recreation 12. This new BAA has been developed to address the question – What can I learn about myself by learning about others and my environment? Students will participate in small groups in conjunction with a teacher mentor and a community member to plan, prepare, and participate in a week-long backcountry leadership and team building experience in a National or Provincial Park. The main project objectives include students gaining real world experiences, problem solving skills, coping skills, and environmental awareness.

Outcome:

The Committee recommended that the Board of Education approve the Board/Authority Authorized (BAA) Course Proposal – Parks and Recreation 12 (Okanagan Mission Secondary School), as attached to the Agenda, and as presented and amended at the June 15, 2022 Education and Student Services Committee Meeting.

<u>Proposal for Substantive Change – Academy for Parks and Recreation (Okanagan Mission Secondary School)</u>

Derek Lea, Principal - Okanagan Mission Secondary School, Amber Otke, Teacher - Okanagan Mission Secondary School, and Kirsten Mulleny, Teacher - Okanagan Mission Secondary School, presented a Proposal for Substantive Change – Academy for Parks and Recreation (Okanagan Mission Secondary School). The Academy for Parks and Recreation is an exciting and vigorous opportunity for grade 12 students to explore the outdoors and learn about the intricacies of backcountry camping and hiking. Participants in this academy will begin preparing for their week-long backcountry leadership and team building experience in spring of their grade 11 school year. Once hiking groups are determined, students complete lessons on planning, packing, backcountry safety and teamwork in addition to beginning their practice hikes to prepare for their September backcountry field studies. The driving force behind this academy is that students will challenge themselves to meet the learning outcomes and personal goals while developing their core competencies including problem solving, personal and social responsibility, and communication.

Outcome:

The Committee recommended that the Board of Education approve the Proposal for Substantive Change – Academy for Parks and Recreation (Okanagan Mission Secondary School), as attached to the Agenda, and as presented and amended at the June 15, 2022 Education and Student Services Committee Meeting.
