4.1 RBC Learn to Play Leadership Grant

Colin Garbutt, RBC Branch Manager, Orchard Plaza, presented a \$25,000 grant cheque for the 2015-2016 school year, to support Physical Literacy mentorship and initiatives in School District No. 23.

 They physical literacy cohort involves 22 teachers representing 12 elementary schools.

- Fundamental movement skills are the building blocks for being active for life and supporting our students' overall well-being.
- Professional learning sessions included Fundamental Movement Skills, Teaching Dance for Understanding (DANCE PL3Y), and assessment strategies for Physical and Health Education.
- HPS coordinators received Fundamental Movement Skill Certification through the National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP).
- Teachers will also be provided with resources to support their learning.

4.2 Beyond the Bell

- YMCA of Okanagan: Beyond the Bell program at George Pringle Elementary. This is the second year that the YMCA has operated this after school program at the school.
- By focusing on prevention, the YMCA Beyond the Bell program provides atrisk children in Grades 1-5 with the additional help and attention they need
