 - 2. If the catchment for English speaking students at Rose Valley Elementary School would change from Constable Neil Bruce Middle School to Glenrosa Middle School.

The Superintendent of Schools/CEO stated as the District would be recruiting for full-time teacher positions, filling them should not be an issue. The Superintendent also stated that there are no plans for the English speaking Rose Valley Elementary School students to go to Glenrosa Middle School.

- Ms. Neukomm also asked for an update on the Westside grade reconfiguration. The Superintendent of Schools/CEO advised that it is going well; transition meetings have been continuing and leadership opportunities have been provided for grade 5 and 9 students as appropriate.
