- The election process took place in October resulting in three new Trustees joining the Board of Education

- Approved the 2019/2020 annual budget of \$264,765,096
- Hosted five Community Learning Forums and attended 12 School Community Learning Conversations

- Approved an Urban Aboriginal Head Start Preschool at South Rutland Elementary School
- 3 new Board Policies were created, 24 Policies/Regulations/ Appendix/Forms were amended, and 1 Policy was affirmed

Health and Safety



- Our Health and Safety Department managed claims for 32 School Districts in the Province
- Revenue totaling \$200,753 is obtained through three sources:
 - 1. Claims Management Shared Services net \$98,136
 - 2. Online Safety Courses net \$22,300
 - 3. COR Safety Audit net \$80,317



International Education

 The International Education Program generated net revenues for the District in excess of \$3.5M this year with 527 students (379 FTE) coming from 36 countries

MANAGING THE VOLUME OF CHANGE WITHIN THE SYSTEM.....



- The Human Resources Department processed (as of June 25th):
 - 397 support staff postings
 - 302 teacher postings during the Spring staffing period
 - 42 Principal and Vice-Principal changes (retirements, resignations, appointments and reassignments)
 - 152 new Teachers Teaching on Call (TTOC) hired
