
- alternatively, he can catch the bus on the SOUTH side of the highway and ride it through all the neighborhoods it takes to then come out at and continue west on

I have had to accept the task of driving him to school in the morning as I don't trust things to not go wrong leading to me getting a call at work requiring me to come assist my stranded kid. I am hoping for another solution to our challenging dilemma;
