A presentation was reviewed with the Board highlighting the many facets of the Habitat for Humanity trip that took place over the Spring Break. The Leaders and students spoke of their experiences travelling to and from El Salvador, as well as the important work undertaken by Habitat for Humanity. The people of the area they met were warm and welcoming and many formed friendships for life and also enhanced their leadership and community and global citizenship capacities.

Presentation: Our Children Are Watching: Engaging Our Community in Positive Civics

Presenters Jane Nordquist, Teacher at Rose Valley Elementary School, and Sarah Shakespeare, Vice-President of COPAC, presented information to the Board highlighting the importance of engaging students at an early age in promoting positive civic responsibility. The presenters asked that the Board of Education endorse the creation of a committee of all partner groups to promote more mindful civics, focus more attention on the civics being taught in our schools and to consider collaborating with UBCO for a Civic Inquiry Project. The Board agreed to refer this to the Coordinating Committee for consideration.

TRUSTEES QUERIES/COMMENTS

Trustee Fraser

Queried District staff regarding an update on the Westside Review study.

The Secretary-Treasurer confirmed the Project Information Report (PIR) was reviewed by the Board. The project request is with the Ministry for review. The Secretary-Treasurer also advised that the request will form part of the Capital Plan that will come forward to the Board in June. The project will then move towards a Project Development Report (PDR) at which time options will be presented to the Board for its review.

Trustee Fraser

Queried District staff regarding Board policy pertaining to use of e-cigarettes and vaping products in or near schools grounds.

The Board Chair noted Board Policy 640 – District Smoke Free Environment, addresses that matter and notes smoking of any kind, whether vaping products, e-cigarettes or regular tobacco, is not to be used on school grounds. As well, it is an illegal activity under legislation.

Trustee Cacchioni

Queried whether the RCMP School Resource Officers would be invited to a Board of Education Public Meeting to be recognized for their service to the school communities.

The Superintendent of Schools/CEO advised both the Officers finishing their duties as School Resource Officers, as well as the newly appointed Officers, will be invited to an upcoming Public Board Meeting for recognition.

Trustee Baxter

Commented on a newspaper article which noted that the Westbank Lions Club recently donated \$1,000 to George Pringle Elementary School and queried whether the schools advise the District when local service clubs donate funds.

The Superintendent of Schools/CEO advised the donations are school based; however, the school Administrators can be requested to advise the District office when these donations occur so that the Board of Education can express recognition and appreciation for the hard work the service clubs do in the District.
