Information Items

1. Overview of Budget Allocation

The Director of Finance reviewed the information provided in the Estimated Operating Grants – 2012/2013 School Year Report. Committee members discussed Ministry hold-back funding for next year, which is provided to districts once enrolment numbers have been finalized. As enrolment projections have become increasingly more accurate in the past few years, the Ministry is reducing the amount of funds held back until final enrolments have been established.

Committee members requested information on districts participating in funding protection due to declining enrolment. The Central Okanagan School District's enrolment has either remained constant or increased over the past few years and, as a result, the District does not participate in funding protection.
