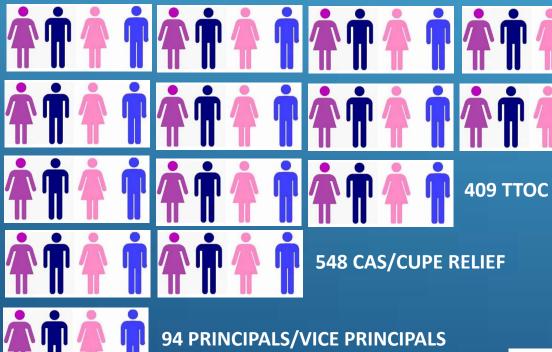

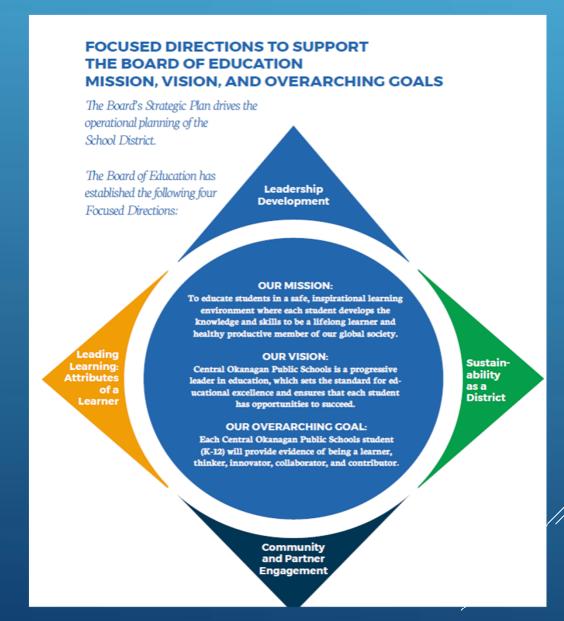

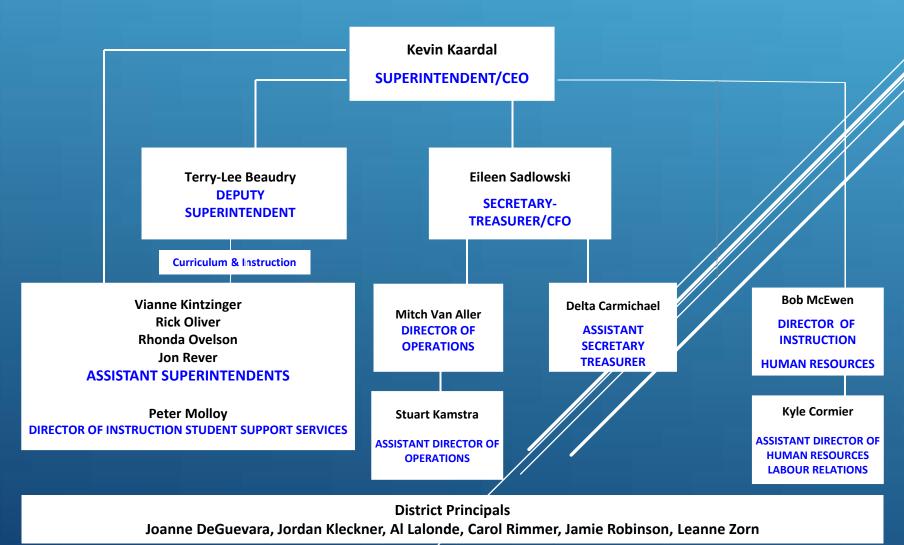

CENTRAL OKANAGAN PUBLIC SCHOOLS WHAT DOES A TRUSTEE DO?



- The governance and oversight of the school district
- Establish the District's strategic direction, ensuring local students receive the best Kindergarten to Grade 12 education
- Act as a financial steward oversight of financial decisions and the assets
- Are part of a team membership of a corporate board, not individual trustees
- Are community leaders represent the interests of their community

- > Are employers of the District -
 - Superintendent/CEO is the board's key employee
 - Personal service contracts for exempt employees and COPVPA
 - Collective agreements for all other employees (COTA and CUPE expire June 30, 2019)
 - Governance for labour relations

CENTRAL OKANAGAN PUBLIC SCHOOLS OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

- Canadian citizen (18 years or older)
- > BC resident for at least 6 months
- Not disqualified under the School Act
- Not an SD#23 employee
- Criminal record check required
- Minimum of two (2) nominators and a \$100 refundable deposit
- > Financial interests disclosure
- > Follow election rules and campaign financing guidelines
