Trustee Fraser queried what impact the bus registration deadline extension had on the final registration numbers.

The Secretary-Treasurer/CFO shared that over 1,000 applications were received after the extension was announced to families. Currently, the Transportation Department is working on processing registrations and will notify parents accordingly.

Trustee Geistlinger requested a progress update on the construction of H.S. Grenda Middle School.

The Secretary-Treasurer/CFO stated that the contractor has started to pour the third floor and it's anticipated to be closed up for the winter. Construction is progressing and on target.

Trustee Baxter stated that the District really won't know the status of Transportation until the last minute.

The Superintendent of Schools/CEO stated that Superintendents and the province are reviewing what school bus regulations will be needed for the Fall. He also advised that the Secretary-Treasurer/CFO and the Transportation Manager are developing response plans for each stage of the K-12 Education Restart Plan and will present their plans at the August 19, 2020 Planning and Facilities Committee Meeting
