CENTRAL OKANAGAN PUBLIC SCHOOLS - "INSIDE 23"

Potential Flooding at George Elliot Secondary School

Mike Daley, Central Okanagan Public Schools Grounds Coordinator, provided an overview of the steps that were taken in early May 2017 as the nearby Vernon Creek was breaching its banks and threatening to flood George Elliot Secondary School. A large-scale sand-bagging operation, which utilized assistance from both students and staff, allowed sufficient sand bags to be filled and then appropriately placed to keep the waters at bay.

The Superintendent of Schools/CEO highlighted pictures taken during that time at the school which showed the rising creek and the potential breach of the banks.

Kathy Weninger, Principal at George Elliot Secondary School, congratulated the team and coaches for their exemplary performance and lauded the work required to get to this level of competition.

Superintendent of Schools/CEO – Report on Student Achievement

The Superintendent of Schools/CEO presented the annual Report on Student Achievement, reviewing the District's Mission and Vision statements as well as the Central Okanagan Public Schools' Cultural Values. It was noted that the District serves over 195,000 citizens throughout the Central Okanagan and has a strong relationship with its Partner Groups (Central Okanagan Teachers' Association, Canadian Union of Public Employees, Central Okanagan Principals and Vice-Principals Association, Central Okanagan Parent Advisory Council and District Student Council). The Superintendent of Schools/CEO provided grade distribution data for the District's 23,004 students.

Early Learning Programs, including preschools and StrongStart, serve more than 600 families each year. The Superintendent of Schools/CEO also reviewed the process for transitioning young learners to Kindergarten, the Early Learning Profile, and Grade 3 reading levels (ensuring that foundational decoding skills are in place prior to the end of grade two to facilitate reading comprehension and to foster the joy of reading literature independently at grade 3). The transfer of Literacy Foundational Skills and building upon the foundational skills, and the resulting achievements District-wide were reviewed. The District's combined six-year completion rate (with Evergreen successes) is 96.4%. Information pertaining to students' transition to post-secondary institutions was reviewed. The Superintendent of Schools/CEO noted that BC is currently the 2nd highest performing education jurisdiction in the world and that Central Okanagan Public Schools' students achieve above both national and provincial measures.

The Superintendent of Schools/CEO advised the presentation will be posted to the District's website.
