TRUSTEES QUERIES/COMMENTS

All trustees were provided with an opportunity to comment on their involvement, since the previous Board meeting, in District activities.

Trustee Cacchioni

Queried the impact of the new provincial student demographic system (MyEducation BC) which school districts are converting to for the 2015/2016 school year, and whether an estimate has been developed for the amount and cost of training, whether technical upgrades will be required to support the new system, and where the disaster backup system is located.

The Superintendent responded that the technical infrastructure is currently in place to support the new system and the District is using the "Train the Trainer" model, focusing on a few key individuals at each school who will be provided with training to, in turn, support their colleagues with the new system at their school. "Just in time" training will be provided to teachers on the first day of school to give them the ability to access class lists, complete attendance, etc. Additional training on an early dismissal day will then be provided to teachers to prepare for the first reporting period. A separate training plan is in place for support staff. The initial training budget and implementation plan has been established at \$200,000. This cost will be factored into the Technology Budget and will impact future expenditures on previously planned technological projects.

The Secretary-Treasurer advised that the backup system is in Eastern Canada and the company in Vancouver that is operating the current student administration system will not change.

Trustee Baxter

Commented on the recent Aboriginal Gathering which was held in partnership with the Ministry and the School District.

The Assistant Superintendent will convey the Board's appreciation to Joanne DeGuevara, District Principal of the Aboriginal Education Program, for her work on the Aboriginal Gathering.

Trustee Baxter

Requested a follow-up on the letter sent out by the BC Public School Employers' Association (BCPSEA) with regard to the Central Okanagan School District's submitted resolution advocating for the reinstatement of the BCPSEA Board of Directors, which was amended and passed at the January 30th BCPSEA AGM.

Shelley Courtney, COPAC member, requested clarification on the provincial announcement of \$29 million in cuts to school districts in the 2015/2016 school year and further cuts in the 2016/2017 school year.

The Board Chair responded that the provincial government has announced \$29 million in cuts to school districts for the 2015/2016 school year and a further \$25 million for the 2016/2017 school year. These cuts are expected to be maintained for the 2017/2018 school year. The combined total of cuts for the next three years is \$54 million. The provincial announcement regarding school district grant funding for 2015/2016, including specific information regarding the cuts, will be made on Thursday, March 12th.

Superintendent's Emergent Issues

Ministry of Education Regional Innovation Forums

- The Ministry of Education has advised that a Regional Innovation Forum will be held in Kelowna, on Friday, April 10th.
- The Regional Forums are a follow-up to a session held in Vancouver in January 2015 and will focus on education innovation and the education transformation journey.
- The Forums are set to take place in Courtney/Comox, Kelowna, Prince George, Fort St. John, Surrey and Cranbrook.
- The Ministry has specific expectations regarding the invitation list which will include approximately 70% community members and 30% educators.
- Superintendents and Board Chairs from neighbouring school districts will be invited to attend as well as local Partner Group Presidents.
- Community members to be invited include Municipal Mayors, representatives from Westbank First Nation and the Central Okanagan Regional District, and prominent members of the business community. Invitations will be sent out by the Ministry's office.
