Tallus Ridge Residents - Busing Issues

Presenter: Jason Ritchie, Tallus Ridge Resident

Mr. Ritchie presented to the Board of Education on behalf of residents of the Tallus Ridge area on their concerns on the recent amendment to Policy 470R – Transportation Services Management (*Regulations*). Mr. Ritchie stated that high school students in the area do not have options to get to school effectively and safely.

The Secretary-Treasurer/CFO confirmed that students were previously accommodated on a school bus as courtesy riders, however this was not possible this year due to more elementary and middle school students now being eligible due to the Board's decision to support the premises that the District prioritize younger riders and reduce walk limits. COVID-19 restrictions also limit the number of students per seat to meet the requirements of the District's Safety Plan.

Trustee Tiede confirmed that a Motion has been put forth to the Thompson-Okanagan Branch Meeting regarding transportation.

STAFF PRESENTATIONS

Superintendent of Schools/CEO: 2020 School Opening Report - Part 2

Presenter: Kevin Kaardal, Superintendent of Schools/CEO

The Superintendent of Schools/CEO presented the 2020 School Opening Report - Part 2. This report provides detailed information about school enrolment effective September 29, 2020. To date, the District has enrolled 22,697 students this year (excluding Central Programs and Services and other programs).

TRUSTEES QUERIES/COMMENTS

Trustee Desrosiers queried if secondary schools, under the new quarter system, will be having student-parent-teacher interviews every quarter. The Superintendent of Schools/CEO stated that the District is currently working through the Central Okanagan Teachers' Association Collective Agreement to determine how to support secondary teachers reporting to parents.

Trustee Bowman queried how the situation with noon hour supervision is going so far. The Secretary-Treasurer/CFO stated that the District has allocated Federal funding to double the resources for noon hour supervision and Principals are currently recruiting for the additional Noon Hour Supervisor positions.

Trustee Bowman queried how the issue with hand washing stations for portable classrooms is being dealt with as the winter months approach. The Secretary-Treasurer/CFO stated that every classroom has hand sanitizer and the Operations Department is working on options for hand washing stations for portable classrooms with each school. The Superintendent of Schools/CEO

advised that hand washing stations in every portable classroom is unlikely and stated that hand sanitizer is the health requirement. The District will try to improve the situation in the best way possible.

Trustee Bowman queried if the demand for nutritional supports for students is similar to the Spring. The Superintendent of Schools/CEO stated that the demand has grown every year, regardless of a pandemic or not, and the District continues to coordinate food service programs with external agencies.

Trustee Geistlinger stated that she has received feedback from parents that a search functionality for Board Meetings be added to the District's website. The Board Chair requested that the Office of the Secretary-Treasurer look into this matter and report back to the Board.

Trustee Cacchioni queried how many Chromebooks were purchased by parents. The Superintendent of Schools/CEO advised that all 750 Chromebooks have sold out and the District has ordered more to continue the program.

Trustee Cacchioni queried if Telus and Shaw are still offering free wifi to parents. The Superintendent of Schools/CEO stated that he will follow-up and advise the Board.

Trustee Tiede requested an overview of the process on how identified COVID-19 cases will be communicated to parents. The Superintendent of Schools/CEO provided a broad overview and stated that the approved communication plan with the Interior Health Association will come forward to the October 14, 2020 Public Board Meeting.

The COTA President queried if the District is aware of the delay in COVID-19 testing results due to the Interior Health Association sending tests to Vancouver. The Superintendent of Schools/CEO stated that the District has heard that inconclusive COVID-19 tests go to Vancouver; however, no other delays have been reported to the District.

- returning catchment area students that have transferred into the school or program they previously attended from eSchoolBC, <u>a Homeschooling or a Distributed Learning program offered by another educational organization</u>;
- new catchment area students;
- siblings of non-catchment area students currently enrolled in the school;
- non-catchment area students who request to attend the school which is other than their catchment area school;
- non-district area students;
- international students.
